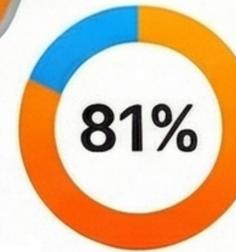
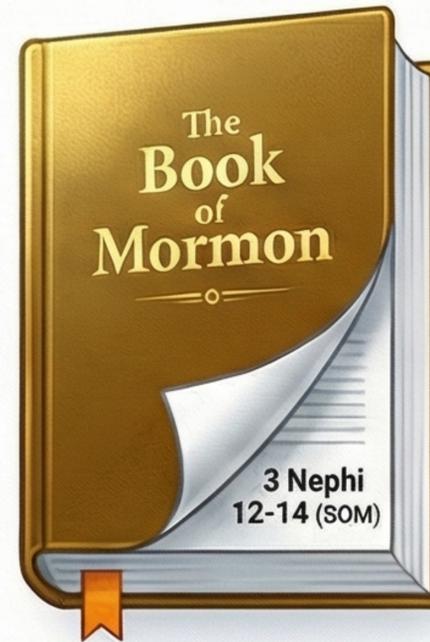


The sermon copies a text translated twice (Aramaic -> Greek -> English) over many centuries.

Includes Known Biblical Errors

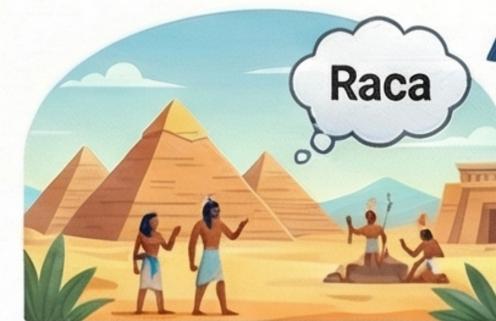
For thine, to its powerful,
For thine is the kingdom... **X**
that scholars know was a late addition
Late addition, not in original manuscripts.

The Book of Mormon (BOM)



81% Copied Verbatim
The Book of Mormon's sermon is a direct, word-for-word copy of Matthew 5-7 from the KJV Bible.

A Foreign Word Anachronism



The text includes the Aramaic word "Raca" (fool), which would be meaningless in ancient America.

The Author's Fingerprints: Obvious Fixes, Subtle Errors

Change Type	KJV Bible Text (The Problem)	Book of Mormon Text (The Result)
CONSCIOUS FIX	...paid the uttermost farthing. (An English coin)	...paid the uttermost cenine. (A Nephite coin)
UNCONSCIOUS ERROR	...compel thee to go a mile... (A specific Roman law)	...compel thee to go a mile... (Roman law left in)

...but missed a more subtle historical one, revealing the King James Bible as the source text.
